Food insecurity has become a national emergency

- It took 25 years for food bank visits in Canada to reach 1 million visits a month, but just 5 years for that figure to *double*.
- Almost one quarter (23%) of people in this country are living with food insecurity.
- Seventy percent of food bank clients live in market rental housing. The connection between affordable housing and food insecurity is undeniable.
- Working But Still Struggling. Nearly 1 in 5 food bank clients are employed but still can't make ends meet. Having a job is no longer a guarantee of food security
